## Lake Michigan Water Update

### WATER DELIVERY ANTICIPATED SUMMER 2019

Construction is underway on the 9-mile pipe that will bring Lake Michigan Water to Volo and Wauconda.

The transmission main, which will extend from Libertyville (US 45 & IL 137) to Volo and Wauconda, is being constructed in four segments.

#### Segment #1 - COMPLETE

Route: Midlothian Rd to Alleghany Rd via ComEd right-of-way

#### Segment #2 - Start: November 2018

Complete: Spring 2019

Route: Alleghany Rd / Peterson Rd / IL 60

#### Segment #3 - Start: Spring 2019

Complete: Summer 2019

Route: Chardon Rd

#### Segment #4 - UNDER CONSTRUCTION

Complete: Winter 2018

Route: Gilmer Rd / Fish Lake Rd

Delivery of Lake Michigan Water is anticipated in Summer 2019.

## Leaf Collection

During the month of November, Groot will offer FREE leaf collection.

Leaves must be placed in separate paper landscape waste bags. Stickers are not required for bags containing leaves only.

Village Ordinance prohibits burning leaves and other landscape waste.

## Clothing & Shoe Recycling

In partnership with the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO), the Village offers clothing and shoe recycling.

The clothing and shoe recycling containers are located in the northwest corner of the Village Hall parking lot.

## Garage & Porch Lights

Residents are encouraged to turn on their garage and porch lights after dark. These lights supplement the street lights and enhance the safety of our neighborhoods.

Most garage and porch lights can be placed on a timer or photocell to automatically turn on after dark.

## Winter Parking Regulations

Pursuant to Village Ordinance, parking is prohibited on all Village streets after a snowfall of two or more inches, until snow removal operations are complete.

Vehicles found in violation of this ordinance are subject to ticketing and towing.

## Sidewalks, Driveways & Fire Hydrants

Pursuant to Village Ordinance, property owners are required to clear sidewalks of snow and ice within 24 hours of a snowfall.

When clearing driveways, pile snow to the right of the driveway when facing the street to limit the snow thrown back by plows. Village Ordinance prohibits dumping snow in the street when clearing sidewalks and driveways.

Residents are asked to remove snow and ice around fire hydrants so they are clear and accessible to emergency fire crews.
