2019 Winter Season Information

Each winter season, the Village coordinates snow and ice removal operations for its 17.5 miles of streets.

Public Works crews plow Lancaster Falls, Autumn Grove, and Symphony Meadows and Grant Township plows Terra Springs and Remington Pointe.

During winter storm events, the Village's snow and ice removal crews work diligently to make sure road conditions are as safe as possible.

Unfortunately, the Village cannot control the severity of winter weather. Storms may consist of combinations of rain, ice, and large accumulations of snow, which can lead to difficult driving conditions.

Please remember to exercise caution when driving this winter season.

Christmas Tree Pick-Up

Christmas Tree Pick-Up will take place in conjunction with garbage pick-up on January 7th and 14th.

Trees greater than six (6) feet in height must be cut in half prior to being set out for pick-up.

Groot will not pick up trees in plastic bags.

Cart Exchange Program

Enrollment for the garbage/recycling cart exchange program will take place between February 1st and March 15th.

Residents may request a smaller garbage cart or a larger recycling cart.

Garage & Porch Lights

Residents are encouraged to turn on their garage and porch lights after dark. These lights supplement the street lights and enhance the safety of our neighborhoods.

Most garage and porch lights can be placed on a timer or photocell to automatically turn on after dark.

Clothing & Shoe Recycling

In partnership with the Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO), the Village offers clothing and shoe recycling.

The clothing and shoe recycling containers are located in the northwest corner of the Village Hall parking lot.

Winter Parking Regulations

Pursuant to Village Ordinance, parking is prohibited on all Village streets after a snowfall of two or more inches, until snow removal operations are complete.

Vehicles found in violation of this ordinance are subject to ticketing and towing.

Residents with disabled vehicles should contact the Lake County Sheriff's Office at (847) 549-5200.

From the Mayor...

In December, the Village Board approved the annual tax levy (\$1,284,866) and abated a portion of the special taxes for each Special Service Area. The amounts the special taxes for each SSA will be reduced by are listed below:

SSA #2 - Remington Pointe (10.86% reduction)

- Single-Family: \$278.46
- Ranch Villa: \$179.92
- Townhome: \$179.92

SSA #3 - Symphony Meadows (26.68% reduction)

- Single-Family: \$659.76
- Duplex: \$419.92
- Townhome: \$419.92

SSA #6 - Lancaster Falls (26.68% reduction)

- Single-Family: \$597.34

In total, the Village abated approximately \$700,000 in special taxes, collecting only the amount required to make the bond payments.

SSA taxes are billed on your property tax bill, which are mailed by the Lake County Treasurer's Office the first week of May.

Sidewalks, Driveways & Fire Hydrants

Pursuant to Village Ordinance, property owners are required to clear sidewalks of snow and ice within 24 hours of a snowfall.

When clearing driveways, pile snow to the right of the driveway when facing the street to limit the snow thrown back by plows. Village Ordinance prohibits dumping snow in the street when clearing sidewalks and driveways.

Residents are asked to remove snow and ice around fire hydrants so they are clear and accessible to emergency fire crews.
